Keynote speech by Imran Rasul (UCL)

The aim of this two-day workshop is to bring together researchers working on **small business**, **development and growth** to present and discuss their ongoing research. We invite submissions of both empirical and theoretical papers with either microeconomic and macroeconomic approaches, with a **focus on issues that are of importance to emerging and developing economies**, such as:

- Access to external finance;
- Access to input and output markets, participation in export markets and global value chains;
- Managerial efficiency, span of control, and delegation;
- Informality;
- Innovation and technology adoption;
- Entrepreneurship and business dynamics;
- Public policies to stimulate small business growth, etc.

The conference will feature a **keynote speech** by **Imran Rasul** (University College London) and there will be a **policy panel on policy options to foster SME growth**. Confirmed panelists: Debora Revoltella (EIB), Sara Bertin (African Development Bank), Harry Devonshire (Argidius Foundation), Hicham Zanati (Tamwilcom).

The workshop, hosted by Bank Al-Maghrib, will be held in <u>Rabat</u>, Morocco on October 3rd and 4th, 2022. The conference organizers will cover lunches, the conference dinner, travel and hotel accommodations for all participants. Conditions for reimbursement will follow the <u>CEPR guidelines</u>. The workshop will be held **in person** except for the policy panel, which will be broadcasted live.

We plan to include 8-10 papers with discussants. Please indicate at the time of submission whether you would be willing to act as a discussant.
